# Lesson 1

Living out Christ's Win | Acts 1:1 - 8

#### **START MEETING**

• If you were in the place of the disciples, how would you have felt about Jesus leaving for heaven?

### **READ AND DISCUSS BIBLE**

- Jesus and the disciples had a different idea of how God's kingdom purposes would advance on earth. Read Zechariah 8:20 - 23; Isaiah 2:1 to gain an understanding of the disciples' views. How does it contrast to what Jesus says to them in Acts 1:7 - 8.1
- 2. The 4 gospels end off with Christ's win: His victory over the forces that cause brokenness in creation, like sin, death and suffering. How does acknowledging this win change our perspective on life?
- 3. Have you ever been in a position where you had to wait for something from God? What was your experience like?
- 4. Read Isaiah 40:28 31 (ESV). What can you learn from these verses about waiting on God?
