START MEETING

- 1. What was the mountain top experience in your life?
- 2. When has a mountain top experience in your life been followed by a valley experience? How did you cope?

READ AND DISCUSS BIBLE

- 1. It's been six days since Peter confessed Jesus as the Christ, and Jesus predicted his death. Why is that information necessary for what happens next? Who does Jesus invite as a witness?
- 2. Why do you think Jesus took the three disciples to the mountain to see his Transfiguration? What does the Transfiguration tell us about who Jesus is? What did Moses and Elijah, and Jesus talk about?
- 3. How do you think the transfiguration affected the Disciples' faith and purpose?
- 4. Why couldn't the disciples drive out the demon? Discuss Jesus' answer. What does this have to do with prayer and fasting? How is a person's personal prayer life the key to being used by God and using God's power? Can you give an example?
- 5. Why is Jesus exempt from the temple tax? What lesson was Jesus teaching Peter by paying the tax? What is at stake when we offend someone?
