---

## START MEETING

- Share with one another the most difficult/challenging thing you ever did?

## READ AND DISCUSS BIBLE

1. Read Matthew 26:6 - 13. Compare between how the disciples and Jesus perceived the act of the woman. What do you think lay behind the attitude of the disciples?
2. How did Peter and the other disciples respond to Jesus's announcement that they will fail Him? In what ways might you overestimate your own strength, even as you seek to obey him?
3. The Lord's supper (the bread and cup) signify something. Read the following passages, and explain how it may help you to appreciate the fuller significance of Lord's Supper:
  - a) John 6:51-58
  - b) Romans 5:6 - 10
4. Read the Hebrews 8:6 - 13. What are the things God promises to do in this New Covenant? How does it make you feel that God is the primary agent & initiator in this New Covenant?
5. Read Matthew 26: 69 - 75. Have you ever felt like Peter, in that you you have disowned Jesus when under pressure ?

The disciples brought nothing to the table, not even their commitment. But Jesus brings everything to the table, with the Lord's Supper as a sign and seal of His forgiveness, love and commitment to them.
