Where on earth is God? | Matthew 27

START MEETING

• Has there been a time when you have doubted God's existence or God's goodness? Why so?

READ AND DISCUSS BIBLE

- 1. Read through the events of Jesus's trial, from Matthew 27:1 50 slowly and reflectively. What is it that strikes you about Jesus? About people
- 2. The events of Matthew 27 reveal the ordinary ways in which evil takes hold of people, in the examples of the religious leaders, Pilate, the people of Jerusalem, and the soldiers. Do you see such parallels in your life, or in the world today?
- 3. Jesus was taunted by various groups while He hung from the cross, which parallels Satan's temptation in Matthew 4. Why did He not respond to their demands? How might you have reacted in His shoes?
- 4. Read Isaiah 53:1 10. How has Jesus fulfilled the words of this Old Testament passage? How does Isaiah 53 help you understand the significance of what Jesus did on the cross.
